CREATING QUALITY PLACES

Earlier this year, it was announced that Strengthening Stark was selected for the Paradox Prize, a grant from the Fund for Our Economic Future that focuses on implementing solutions to solve the transportation/workforce paradox: Individuals cannot find employment without transportation and can't afford transportation without employment. With the Paradox Prize dollars, Strengthening is working with community partners including SARTA, Stark State College, Goodwill, Greater Stark County Urban League (GSCUL), Jobs Ohio, and local employers, to pilot a program called Stark Career Connect. This program will connect candidates looking for careers offering a high wage, short trainings, and job sustainability. Community partners such as Goodwill and GSCUL will help candidates through the process from initial interest to job retention.

During the exploration phase of this program, Stark State College's CDL program was highlighted as a solid opportunity to get new drivers into jobs with a starting salary in the range of \$35,000-65,000 with incredible wage increases available as experience is gained.

Stark State's CDL program is financial aid eligible, and other funding is available to help with training costs, childcare, additional expenses, etc. Candidates interested in the CDL program can contact Goodwill or GSCUL to be guided through the process.



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Transportation is being planned by SARTA and plans will be released soon.

Strengthening Stark looks forward to identifying other opportunities in addition to CDL as more community partners come to the table.

protocols are being followed to help keep customers and employees healthy and to aid in preventing the spread of COVID-19."


GROWING THE MOVEMENT
