HOW LOCAL ECONOMIES GROW & EXPAND: THE MANUFACTURING CONNECTION

NURTURING BUSINESS GROWTH

Last month, we talked about how we accomplish our shared vision for a more vibrant and growing Stark County. William Furth, *The Flow of Money* author and President of POLICOM Corporation, explains the basics of what every community needs to do to cause growth or to stop decline in *Economic Analysis Everyone Understands*. Business growth and sustainability is one of the 3 key areas of focus to create economic vibrancy and we pay particular attention to those businesses who sell their goods and services outside of Stark County. Strengthening Stark has several community partners who drive growth in Manufacturing, Plastics and Polymers, and Agriculture and Tourism. This month, we'll explore the work that's focused on growing and retaining businesses in the manufacturing sector.

One of Strengthening Stark's key partners, the **STARK ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT BOARD (SEDB)** focuses on businesses that manufacture goods or services that bring revenue from outside of Stark County into the community. Their mission is to strengthen Stark County by driving business growth and leading its economic transformation. In addition to helping businesses obtain grant dollars that support their growth and development, SEDB seeks to be a point of contact, directing businesses to the great network of partners who can assist them with opportunities and remove barriers to their success.

Below are the YTD performance metrics for the Stark Economic Development Board. These numbers reflect the collaborative work of partners across Stark along with assistance from our regional and state partners at Team NEO and Jobs Ohio. As you can see, the numbers below are a significant improvement over 2019 and we still have several weeks to go in 2020!

HOW WE STRENGTHEN STARK: EARLY CHILDHOOD RESOURCE CENTER

COMMUNITY COMMITMENT



Started in 2000, the Early Childhood Resource Center is a nonprofit organization that promotes the development of young children by improving the quality of their early education and care through comprehensive programming, resources, and support services for families, their children and early childhood professionals.

As the state of Ohio designated Child Care Resource and Referral agency for Stark County, our primary role is to increase demand for and the supply of high quality child care.

EARLY CHILDHOOD RESOURCE CENTER

The Early Childhood Resource Center first connected with Strengthening Stark in spring 2020 and immediately realized numerous ways in which our work connects to support families in the workforce. Child care is essential to the economy. Without child care, parents cannot work.

Here are just a few ways that we will work together in the future to support parents and their children:

- Provide quality child care referrals and consumer education for parents to meet their individual employment needs
- Building high quality child care programs so families have stable child care solutions
- Support economic development through child care business start-up and by sustaining existing child care businesses including employer operated child care
- Refer parents in our programs to Strengthening Stark's employment resources
- Offer parenting education opportunities to support the family unit

The Early Childhood Resource Center offers a number of programs, resources and services that support parents:

- The SPARK kindergarten readiness program is a family focused program that helps children, ages 3 & 4, get ready for kindergarten by building reading, language, math and social skills
- Parenting Education sessions highlighting child development stages, creating a strong bond, positive discipline techniques and teaching responsibility are offered to Stark County parents in neighborhood locations. Sessions are offered in groups, individually and through online sessions.
- Professional Development classes, technical assistance and mentoring are offered to local child care providers/educators/ staff and people interested in the child care field. Classes are offered online and in group sessions.
- Our Canton location houses a children's library, an indoor play area called the Inspiration Station and an outdoor playground that is perfect for families to explore.

Sharks will hold open office mentoring sessions leading up to this due date. Eight teams will be chosen from all the pitches submitted to participate as finalists in front of our panel of Sharks. The live, virtual final event will take place on April 7, 2021. Finalists could potentially earn up to a \$10,000 investment from Stark County Sharks to pursue their killer



business idea.
