NATIONAL MENTORING MONTH!

COMMUNITY COMMITMENT

January is National Mentoring Month and local mentoring programs want the community to know about the many ways caring adults can connect with young people in Stark County. "Research confirms that quality mentoring relationships have powerful positive effects on young people in a variety of personal, academic, and professional ways, "said Laurie Moline, a local youth mentor, mentoring advocate, and founder of MentorStark. "Mentoring helps facilitate personal growth and development, and provides connections to social and economic opportunity,"

Stark County features many opportunities to connect with young people through programs. Some programs include Legacy Project of Stark County, Hannah's House 119, Junior Achievement, Big Brothers Big Sisters, Foster Grandparents, and programming at local colleges and community centers. The **MENTORSTARK WEBSITE** has more than 35 community and career mentoring programs that are looking for adult volunteers. Prospective mentors are invited to peruse the site to see what programs align with their schedules and areas of interest and then reach out to the individual programs to get more information.

"We have so many amazing programs that are helping young people build connections and social capital, but it is not always easy to find them," said Moline. "Whether you are a parent looking for an opportunity for your child, a young adult looking for a career exploration connection, or an adult or organization looking to connect with youth, MentorStark.org can help you find or create the opportunity that meets your needs."

Twice a month, MentorStark hosts meetings with mentoring program leaders and community stakeholders to discuss best practices, share ideas and activities, and identify opportunities for collaboration. One initiative that has resulted from these meetings is the Stories of Mentoring series, hosted by the Canton Charge, powered by the Cleveland Cavaliers and in collaboration with MentorStark. The series will recognize the power of youth mentoring in the Stark County community and kicks off with two free virtual panel discussions- see our **WEBSITE** for more info.

"One of the recommendations out of the Northeast Ohio Youth Survey was to "promote connectedness," said Moline. "MentorStark is all about creating a more connected community."

It is industry that encompasses many facets and is nestled into every corner of the county. When you ask STARK COUNTY CONVENTION & VISITORS' BUREAU people about what tourism exists in our community, most will acknowledge the many hotel properties or the Pro Football Hall of Fame.



However the tapestry of tourism is far more layered and robust than most people realize. Stark County has ample travel and tourism experiences that communities twice our size envy. Our national one-of-a-kind attractions like the McKinley Presidential Museum, National First Ladies Library, Pro Football Hall of Fame, and retail giants like Hartville MarketPlace which boast attendance of over 2 million guests per year, are just a few of the jewels in our crown of tourism.

The expansion of culinary tourism, driven by the elevation of our many amazing brewery, winery and distillery experiences like Gervasi Vineyard and Maize Valley, draws hundreds of thousands of people to their doors and generates millions of dollars for our communities. Additionally our amazing cultural tourism and parks and recreational destinations not only serve to enhance the quality of life for our residents, but are an active driver of visitors to our region. The fact that we have dozens of museums, a symphony, ballet and countless outdoor park assets makes Stark County a dynamic place to live, work and

The final segment and one of the most important is the many special events and festivals that Stark County is proud to host, including Enshrinement Week powered by Johnson Controls, The OHSAA Football Championships, Massillon Cruise-In and hundreds more. These events consistently bring visitors to the region to generate

significant spending for our community.

We will close with leaving you Stark County tourism by the numbers. These numbers will show you just how vital tourism is to the economic health of our region. We hope that you will be an active ambassador in supporting travel and tourism in your own backyard. You can volunteer at many of these events, support these local tourism businesses and most importantly be a cheerleader for the many WONDERFUL experiences that make Stark County great!

In 2019:

- Tourism generated \$1.8 BILLION dollars in Stark County!
 - \$1.2 BILLION of that is direct VISITOR SPENDING
- Tourism sustained 13,501 Full Time Equivalent jobs in Stark County.
 - That represents 7% of jobs in Stark County
- Tourism generated \$322.5 million dollars payroll for employees in Stark County
- Tourism generated \$210.5 million in tax revenues.
 - This includes \$102.6 million in state and local revenues.
- Tourism tax revenues saved each Stark County household \$672 in 2019!

One-of-a-kind destinations; in a community our size to have three national attractions in the Pro Football Hall of Fame, McKinley Presidential Museum and Monument and the National First Ladies Library is truly remarkable. 
